A Resolution recognizing the life and accomplishments of Yvonne Huser, "Princess Pale Moon"; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, in 1940 Chief William A. Durant and the Council conferred upon Yvonne Huser the title of "Lifetime Princess of the Choctaw Nation," giving her the name of "Princess Pale Moon." As Princess Pale Moon, she represented the Choctaws at ceremonies, powwows, festivals and parades throughout Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, Yvonne Huser incorporated and served as President of Holdenville Inter-Tribal Arts and Crafts, marketing the work of many Native Americans to museums and other outlets. She also incorporated and served as President of the Holdenville Society of Painters and Sculptors; and

WHEREAS, Yvonne Huser has painted, sculpted, and taught art for many years in Holdenville where she maintains a full-time studio and

gallery. Yvonne has exhibited and won awards in juried art shows across the state, including Red Earth, and in 2010 won awards in both painting and sculpture at the Choctaw National Annual Art Show; and

WHEREAS, in 2004, Yvonne Huser was given the Governor's Art Award for Community Service. She continues to preserve Choctaw heritage, culture and legends in her paintings. Her works are in many private collections throughout the country and in foreign countries. Two of her paintings were accepted by the Curatorial Council of the Smithsonian National Museum of the American Indian in Washington, D.C.; and


WHEREAS, an iconic image of "Princess Pale Moon" was once used in a post card that is now part of the historic post card collection on display at the State Capitol.
